When to book a trip

DATS Client Service Centre is open Monday to Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and from 7:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. They can be reached at 780-986-5000, 'option 2'.

DATS menu options are as follows:

- **Press 1** to cancel a trip or to check on a late ride.
- **Press 2** to book or change a trip.
- **Press 3** to register for DATS.
- **Press 4** to submit a commendation, concern, or any other inquiry.
- **Press 5** for IVR self-serve options.
- **Press 6** for subscription requests.

For Monday trips – Call Friday or Saturday (any time), or Sunday (before noon)

For Tuesday trips – Call Saturday or Sunday (any time), or Monday (before noon)


For Wednesday trips – Call Sunday or Monday (any time), or Tuesday (before noon)

For Thursday trips – Call Monday or Tuesday (any time), or Wednesday (before noon)

For Friday trips – Call Tuesday or Wednesday (any time), or Thursday (before noon)

For Saturday trips – Call Wednesday or Thursday (any time), or Friday (before noon)

For Sunday trips – Call Thursday or Friday (any time), or Saturday (before noon)

Travel Training

Are you new to LATS or would you like a refresher on how to use our service? We are here to help! If you would like to learn more about our service and how we can assist you, please call Maureen at 780-980-8445 to arrange for a Travel Training session.

We will come to you and teach you how our service works including how to plan your trips, where to buy fare products, learn who our sponsors are, know the procedures in the event of an emergency, understand what type of carry-on we allow, learn how the bus lift works and much more.

Gratuities

From time to time, clients try to tip our drivers for the service they provide. Although they appreciate the gesture and your kindness, it is the City of Leduc's policy not to allow staff to accept gratuities from the public. If you are happy with the service you receive from a city staff member, kindly let us know by calling into our office at 780-980-8445 or by calling into the main reception line at the City of Leduc at 780-980-7177 and leaving a verbal 'high-5' for the staff member instead. We will ensure to pass your thanks along to them.

Having trouble getting a trip time?

Here at LATS, the busiest times for trip requests are between:

- 8:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., Monday to Friday.
- 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., Monday to Friday.
- 3:30 to p.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday.

If you are having trouble getting a trip during these times, it is because clients are going to/from work or their day program or to/from a medical appointment. Instead, consider travelling between:

- 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., Monday to Friday.
- 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday to Friday.
- 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday to Friday., Monday to Friday.

We are open on Tuesday evenings until 9 p.m., Saturdays from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Sundays from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00

p.m. We allow time at the beginning and end of each shift for our drivers to do a pre-trip/post-trip inspection of the vehicles they are driving.

Recipe corner

Mushroom Soup

- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 large onion, grated
- 4 cloves garlic, grated
- 1 pound mushrooms, chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon fresh thyme, chopped
- 1/4 cup marsala or red wine
- 5 tablespoons flour
- 3 cups vegetable stock, hot
- 3/4 cup sour cream

Method:

Heat oil in a heavy bottomed dutch oven and add onion and garlic. Sauté over medium heat. Add mushrooms, salt and thyme and stir for 3-4 minutes. Add the marsala or red wine and cook some more or until liquid is gone and all the good bits are nicely browned.

Sprinkle the flour over the top and stir. Slowly add the hot vegetable stock, 1 cup at a time and whisk until no lumps remain.

Turn the heat down to low and stir in the sour cream. Add pepper to taste. If soup seems too thick, you can add a little more vegetable stock. Serve with garlic crostini.





Indoor Pool Closure

The Indoor Pool will be closed for annual maintenance and some exciting new behind-the-scenes changes to the pools.

August 25 – September 16

- Indoor Aquatic Centre will be closed to the public.
- Join us at the Alexandra Outdoor Pool from August 26 – September 4.
- LRC Memberships will be accepted at the Beaumont Recreation Facility during this timeframe.

September 17 – October 21

- Main Pool and Hot Tub will be open to the public. Limited programs and public swim opportunities will be offered during this timeframe.
- Leisure Pool, Whirlpool, and Steam Room will be CLOSED for continued renovations.

Clothes Dryer Safety

Doing laundry is most likely part of your every day routine. But did you know how important taking care of your clothes dryer is to the safety of your home? With a few simple safety tips you can help prevent a clothes dryer fire.

- Have your dryer installed and serviced by a professional.
- Do not use the dryer without a lint filter.
- Make sure you clean the lint filter before or after each load of laundry. Remove lint that has collected around the drum.
- Rigid or flexible metal venting material should be used to sustain proper air flow and drying time.
- Make sure the air exhaust vent pipe is not restricted and the outdoor vent flap will open when the dryer is operating. Once a year, or more often if you notice that it is taking longer than normal for your clothes to dry, clean lint out of the vent pipe or have a dryer lint removal service do it for you.
- Keep dryers in good working order. Gas dryers should be inspected by a qualified professional to make sure that the gas line and connection are intact and free of leaks.
- Make sure the right plug and outlet are used and that the machine is connected properly.
- Follow the manufacturer's operating instructions and don't overload your dryer.
- Turn the dryer off if you leave home or when you go to bed.

AND Don'T Forget...

Dryers should be properly **grounded**.

Check the **outdoor vent** flap to make sure it is not covered by snow.

Keep the area around your dryer **clear** of things that can burn, like boxes, cleaning supplies and clothing, etc.

Clothes that have come in contact with **flammable substances**, like gasoline, paint thinner, or similar solvents should be laid outside to dry, then can be washed and dried as usual.

FACT

The leading cause of home clothes dryer fires is failure to clean them.
