Important Tips to Remember:

- 2. Avoid high volume call times by calling in the afternoon instead of the morning.
- 3. Plan ahead and try to pre-book your trips up to three days ahead.
- 4. There is no guarantee that a sameday trip can be accommodated.

Move with mobility!

Mobility devices are wonderful additions to the daily lives of those who need them. They help you to get out and enjoy life! Whether you use a grab-bar, cane, walker, wheelchair, scooter or service animal, they help to provide:

- balance for unsteady individuals,
- a restful place to sit,
- a set of wheels to get around on,
- something to lean on,
- a reduction in the risk of a fall,
- safety and stability,
- an extra set of hands,
- and can even be a set of eyes for some.

Mobility devices help you to maintain a healthy lifestyle by allowing you to exercise not only your physical health but your cognitive health as well. How? Well, they keep YOU moving which is essential for your overall health.

They help you to socialize whether it is going for a walk, go shopping or going out for tea. You can enjoy visits with your family and friends or attend church services or medical appointments.

Mobility devices help you to be in control of your life and to preserve your independence!

How does the ½ hour pick-up window work?

When customers book a trip with LATS they are provided with a 30 minute pick-up window. The window is the range of time that your LATS bus is expected to arrive in. If you have booked a ride for 10:15 a.m. then your window is anywhere from 10:15 a.m. to 10:45 a.m.

In order to keep our scheduled rides on time, we ask that you are ready to leave at the beginning of your ½ hour window.

Drivers will meet you at the first set of accessible doors to assist you to the bus. If you would rather make your own way to the bus, just let the driver know.



What cannot be brought onboard?

For safety and storage reasons, large items such as; musical instruments, sports equipment and luggage or duffel bags are not permitted on the bus.

All clients must be able to safely stow their backpacks and grocery bags under their seat.

Did you know?

In 1783, John Dawson of Bath, England, invented a wheelchair named after the town of Bath. Dawson designed a chair with two large wheels and one small one. The Bath wheelchair outsold all other wheelchairs throughout the early part of the 19th century.

The City of Leduc's Public Transportation offers two services:



Leduc Transit is an inter-municipal transit partnership between the City of Leduc and Leduc County, offering a public transit (bus) service that connects the Leduc and Nisku areas and also stops at the Edmonton International Airport and the Century Park LRT station in south Edmonton. This service runs during peak hours in the morning and late afternoon, Monday to Friday.

We also operate Leduc Assisted Transportation Service (LATS), which is a door-to-door, driver-assisted transportation service for seniors (65+) and for persons with cognitive and/or physical disabilities within the City of Leduc. Temporary service may be available to individuals with a temporary disability.

Interesting Facts about Transportation in Alberta

Did you know?

- Alberta's provincial highway network covers 31,000 kilometers, 28,000 of which are paved.
- Alberta Transportation is responsible for nearly 4,500 bridges.
- Alberta has 2 international airports, 11 regional airports and 72 paved community airports.
- Alberta has over 6,800 kilometers of railway track.

Public transportation is an excellent way to save you money and reduce your environmental impact. When you ride public transportation and leave your vehicle at home, you save money on gas, oil changes and vehicle maintenance. Studies continue to show us that public transportation is safer than riding in a car! As an added bonus, public transportation can reduce the number of cars on the road, meaning less traffic congestion and fewer chances for accidents.

People who use the bus are typically healthier because they are getting outside and walking to their bus stop and walking to their final destination after their bus ride. By riding the bus, we are less likely to feel stressed or frustrated, both of which have been linked to high blood pressure, cardiovascular disease and overall decreased immune function which can lead to more colds and general illness.

Did you know that buses emit 80% less carbon monoxide than most cars? That's a lot more 'clean air' for us to breath!

In Alberta, many residents ride public transit every day thanks to the networks of transit vehicles such as: trains, local and commuter buses, shuttle buses and accessible buses.
