Welcome to Spring!

The first official day of Spring falls on Tuesday, March 19th this year. The first day of Spring is referred to it as the Equinox, which is a time when both the Northern and Southern Hemispheres share the same amount of daytime and nighttime hours. What it means is that the earth's axis is not tilted toward or away from the sun.

The word 'equinox' comes from the Latin word *aequinoctium*, meaning "the time of equal days and nights," from *equi* meaning "equal," and *nocti* meaning "night."



How about a walk this Spring?



Did you know that there are more than 85 kilometers of beautiful multi-use trails and pathways within the lovely city of Leduc? An

excellent pathway is at Telford Lake. Telford Lake is a great location to do some yoga, to meditate, have a picnic, read a book, catch some sunshine, walk, run, or cycle around the lake and depending on the time of day that you go, you may even be able to take in a gorgeous sunrise or sunset.

Multiway Guidelines:

- Keep to the right and yield the right-of-way to slower moving pedestrian traffic.
- Alert anyone about to be overtaken and pass on the left.
- Exercise due care and attention to avoid a collision, particularly when entering or exiting the trail onto a roadway or approaching a blind spot, hill or corner.
- Move off the trail when stopped.
- Travel at a speed that is reasonable given the conditions, including weather and traffic volume.

- Clean up after your dog immediately.
- Keep your pet on a leash that's no more than 2m long.

Seniors Outreach

Homemaking Program

- In the City of Leduc
Monday to Friday from 4:45 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.
- In Nisku Business Park
Monday to Friday from 4:45 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Three ways to book your trip

Riders are encouraged to book rides in advance using one of the following methods:

- Download the Pick-Up app from [Google Play](#) or the [Apple Store](#)
- [Book online](#)
- Phone the call centre 780-986-7433.



How it works

- Create an account online or in the app
- Pick the nearest pick-up and drop-off locations
- Select travel times
- Choose seat requirements
- Head to the pick-up stop
- Track the bus in real-time and enjoy the ride

Book trips for right away or up to two weeks in advance for travel between any two bus stops in Leduc or the Nisku Business Park. Bookings will be confirmed within 15-20 minutes, or up to 45 minutes during high-demand times.

The pick-up window is 10 minutes, and the bus can't wait, so be sure to arrive early. The on-demand system calculates the most efficient route based on customer needs, so trips are as fast as possible.

Leduc Transit Services offers subsidized transit passes for low-income residents

In partnership with the Government of Alberta, Leduc Transit is offering eligible Leduc residents half-fare passes for Leduc Transit and Leduc Assisted Transit Services (LATS) local and regional routes.

To access the subsidized passes, residents are required to call Leduc's Family & Community Support Services (FCSS) to arrange an intake meeting and determine whether they qualify.

FAQ

Who is eligible for subsidized transit passes?

To be eligible for the subsidized transit pass program, you must:

- Be a City of Leduc resident
- Prove your household income meets low-income cut off confirmed by an income/bank statement

How do I arrange an intake meeting?

To book an intake meeting, call FCSS at 780-980-7109.

How long do I qualify for a subsidized transit pass once approved?

Once you've been approved, you will be eligible for a reduced transit pass for 12 consecutive months, or until funding is no

longer available.

How do I pick up my subsidized transit pass?

Once approved, you will be able to purchase your subsidized transit pass at the Civic Centre's Finance counter.

For Wednesday trips – Call Sunday or Monday (any time), or Tuesday (before noon)

For Thursday trips – Call Monday or Tuesday (any time), or Wednesday (before noon)

For Friday trips – Call Tuesday or Wednesday (any time), or Thursday (before noon)

For Saturday trips – Call Wednesday or Thursday (any time), or Friday (before noon)

For Sunday trips – Call Thursday or Friday (any time), or Saturday (before

Schedule an appointment to prepare and file your income tax returns

Tax season is coming quickly, and the City of Leduc is here to help low to modest income residents and seniors prepare and file their 2023 income tax returns.

The Volunteer Income Tax Program will be available via telephone or in-person at the Civic Centre. Walk-ins will also be accepted, though we encourage you to call ahead and schedule an appointment.

For assistance with your tax return, or to find out if you are eligible for the program, call FCSS at 780-980-7109.

Last year, volunteers helped 496 residents prepare and file their income tax returns for free.

Recipe Corner - Pineapple Slice

For the crust:

- 2 cups graham cracker crumbs
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- ½ cup unsalted melted, butter
- Pinch of salt

For the filling:

- ½ cup unsalted butter, softened
- 4 ounces full-fat cream cheese
- 2 cups powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup drained, crushed pineapple, divided
- 8 ounces of whipped topping

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line an 8 x 8 pan with parchment paper.

For the filling, in a small mixing bowl, stir together the graham crumbs, sugar, salt and butter. Stir to combine and press into the prepared pan. Bake for 10 minutes and let cool.

For the filling, in a large mixing bowl, beat together butter and cream cheese until combined. Gradually add the powdered sugar and vanilla. Beat until fluffy. Fold in 2 tablespoons of the pineapple. Spread evenly over the prepared crust.

In a separate bowl, mix the remaining pineapple with the whipped topping and spread over the dessert.

Top with toasted coconut if desired or chopped walnuts. Refrigerate until set, 6 to 8 hours. Slice and enjoy!
